

Hearing postponed for teacher facing sexual enticement charges

A bail hearing for a middle school teacher accused of enticing a minor to engage in sexual activity was pushed back a week to give the defense more time to prepare.

Charles Kane, 46, of Spencerport, was in U.S. District Court on Friday on charges that he set up a meeting at a Webster movie theater with a 14-year-old girl, who was actually an undercover law enforcement officer, according to a complaint filed by the U.S. Attorney's office. Kane is a teacher at a middle school in the Hilton school district.

Law enforcement officers began to follow the case in October after spotting a Craigslist post that read "daddy/daughter. Love younger women," according to the complaint.

"Looking for my sweet baby ..." read the post, according to the complaint. "... send me a pic and location baby."

It's alleged that Kane had several months of sexually explicit conversations, and sent photos of himself, according to the complaint. The new bail hearing in front of U.S. Magistrate Marian W. Payson was scheduled for April 10. Attorneys representing both sides declined to comment.
