iPhone offers options for the visually impaired

I have an iPhone 6. I would like to love it. But I am visually impaired. Can I make the text bigger? None of my friends can help me. Thank you.

You may need to get someone to help you set it up, Maria, but you certainly can enlarge the text on your iPhone 6. Go to Settings, select General, then select Accessibility, then select Larger Type. There you will find a slider that can let you set the size of the font that best works for you.

Also in Accessibility, you can set the iPhone to read text to you rather than having to read it yourself. In that same



Accessibility setting, you will find Speak Screen. Pages will be read back to you. Frankly, this works OK in text messaging; not so much in some other apps.

That Accessibility section holds a lot more interesting features. Increasing contrast often helps the visually impaired. Setting the LED to flash on Alerts means you don't have to
