

Former coach pleads guilty to sex crimes with student

A former Brockport High School coach last week pleaded guilty to charges linked to having sexual contact with a 15-year-old student athlete in 2018.

Anne L. Collins, 29, of Greece on Tuesday pleaded guilty to two counts third-degree criminal sexual act, a felony, in state Supreme Court, according to the Monroe County District Attorney's Office. She was facing nine counts of third-degree criminal sexual act, a felony. Collins was initially arrested in June.

Collins was accused of having inappropriate sexual contact with a former student during a six-month span between March and August 2018, according to the Monroe County Sheriff's Office.

Assistant District Attorney Hillary Langdon prosecuted the case.

Collins was 22 at the time of the alleged incidents, deputies said. An investigation determined that none of the alleged encounters took place on school property.

Brockport Superintendent Sean Bruno confirmed last year that Collins was a district employee between 2017 and 2022.

Collins is scheduled to be sentenced by state Supreme Court Justice Judith Sinclair on April 22. She is expected to be sentenced to six months in the Monroe County Jail via what's called shocked probation, and to 10 years sex offender probation, according to the DA's Office. Collins will also be listed on New York's sex offender registry. A no contact order of protection will also be in place for the victim, authorities said.
